#### LOUIS SHICKLUNA was the 1998 Niagara Enterprise Hall Of Fame recipient

On October 14 - the 1998 Niagara Entrepreneur of the year Awards were held in Niagara Falls. Each year, one person is selected into the Historical Hall of Fame. The category recognizes past builders of the Niagara economy. The Society nomination of Louis Shickluna was the 1998 recipient for this award. An article on Louis was a feature of the August 1998 newsletter. Subsequent to the article, Society member Alex Ormston brought to our attention, that Louis Schikluna is mentioned in a book titled: "The Canadian Family Tree-Canada's Peoples" by the Multiculturalism Directorate, Department of Secretary of State, 1979, and published by Corpus of Don Mills, Ontario. (special collections 971.004CanRef.). Page 159 - Maltese - "The first Maltese known to have settled in Canada was Lewis Schikluna who came to St. Catharines, Upper Canada in 1836 and established a shipyard on the Welland Canal at a spot below where the Burgoyne Bridge now spans the ravine."
